# **The Catholic Tent Revival**Stirs Excitement

PICTURE A LARGE 1,000 PERSON "big top" on the field! Is this an illusion or a reality for Malvern Retreat House?

It's a reality for Sunday, October 7th from 12 noon to 7:30 PM; an event for individuals and families featuring an all-star line-up of speakers and musicians. Officially endorsed by Archbishop Charles A. Chaput, this is the first annual Tent Revival at the retreat house.

As a FREE rain or shine event, it has created quite a stir in the Catholic community in the Mid-Atlantic region. "We are busy raising the funds through special sponsorships including businesses, individuals, organizations and families. We didn't want cost to detract people from attending and receiving the special graces of this event. This is why we made the

decision to open our doors in making it a FREE event for all," shared Michael Norton, Vice-President of Institution Advancement. The mission is to provide an outreach to those seeking a deeper relationship with the Lord, a fuller understanding of the church and, an opportunity to encounter joy, hope, mercy and healing.

The tent was secured in late 2017; Advanced Staging Productions, a professional lighting, staging and audio production company stepped forward to assist Malvern in bringing this joyful event to fruition. Steve Wildemann, President of Advanced Staging Productions is a Man of Malvern and offered the expertise of his team for our efforts. The speakers confirmed their involvement without hesitation including Deacon

Jesse Romero, Johnnette
Benkovic and Fr. James
Blount, SOLT. Nashville recording
artist, Teresa Peterson stepped up to
lead praise and worship throughout the day;
Marty Rotella, 3-time Grammy nominee will
introduce the new Malvern theme song and
some of his hits for the crowd.

Mass will be celebrated by Auxiliary Bishop Timothy Senior, confessions will be heard in the field, the rosary will be prayed at 4PM during the time period of the National Rosary Crusade, the Donutman will inspire children with his new series entitled Massterpiece Donut Shop Event, as seen on EWTN.

A few surprise guests will be attending; announcements to be made before the event day.

Food trucks have been secured for the crowd to purchase snacks and meals throughout the day. Ample free parking at Malvern Prep and Radnor Hunt Club with shuttle buses running to the entrance of the retreat house is provided for the crowds. Seating is provided within the tent for 1,000 people; individuals and families are welcome to bring lawn chairs and blankets for seating. Port-a-potties will be stationed throughout the property for the convenience of our guests.

According to Mark Poletunow, President, "we encourage people of all denominations to attend. We anticipate the gift of joy to permeate the grounds, God's healing and mercy."

## Mark's Musings from Malvern

Dear Friends,

The longevity of commitment demonstrated by many of our retreatants is amazing! This spring during the Archbishop Fitzmaurice retreat weekend, I caught up with Lou Twardowski. Lou was in the midst of his 79th retreat. He was happy to be here, but wondered if he would have the strength and energy to return for his 80th year. His brother retreatants are making plans to ensure that

Lou gets to our grounds in 2019 – he is a long-standing example of the value of making a retreat. His perseverance and love of the Lord is inspiring! Imagine this: in 1912, the Retreat League began at St. Charles Seminary; moved to our current location in 1921 (the year Lou was born!); and Lou made his first retreat in 1939. His experience as a retreatant spans 75% of our history! Wow!

While we offer a variety of retreat opportunities, the Men and Women of Malvern remain at the core of our 106-year history. At the same time, the reality of our culture has vastly changed over the past 30, 40, 50, 60, 70, 80 years. Lou can provide personal testimony about this! That is why we continue to embrace our traditional retreats while at the same time we look for new ways to invite people to these holy grounds so that they, too, might experience a Divine encounter with Christ

Attending a retreat on a regular basis has strengthened Lou's faith, made him a better husband and father, and helped him to be the man God made him to be. He would be the first to tell how much he wants others to have this experience. Now, more than ever, we are facing challenging times in society as well as within the Church. Secularism has become the unofficial religion of our time. The scandal of sin and unfaithfulness among some of the

clergy and hierarchy cause us pain and distract us from the Gospel message. Our democracy appears topsy-turvy, and our political leaders often disappoint. We need joy and hope.

A bold way of reaching people with the Good News is through our first Catholic Tent Revival. Please mark your calendar for October 7, 2018 for our first Catholic Tent Revival: THE JOY OF JESUS! HIS MERCY. HIS LOVE. It will be an historic event with a thousand person tent on our grounds and a stage that will fill the open air with powerful preaching and moving music focused on drawing multitudes into a closer relationship with Jesus. When I spoke to him about this event a few months ago, Archbishop Charles Chaput

endorsed it by saying, "The idea of a Catholic tent revival is a good one. I hope it's very successful." His words are so encouraging because he understands the great need for extraordinary evangelization in the Church to reach folks who we would not ordinarily see

at Mass on Sundays or even here on retreat.

This revival is one means of injecting "new wine into new wineskins" so that we can experience renewed strength, to become disciples on fire for Jesus. God calls us to be a living example that will attract others to the true message of the Gospel so that they might know the healing, joy, and peace that comes from a life in Christ.

# Rector's Reflection

#### A Journey through the Lord's Prayer

The Lord's Prayer offers us a marvelous summary of prayer and life in Christ. The Carmelite Fr. Robert McNamara has suggested that while we pray the words of Jesus as He taught, we experience their meaning starting at the end and working toward the beginning, one phrase at a time. Each phrase is a step in spiritual maturity. At times, we move forwards, at other times we slide backwards. With which phrase of the Lord's Prayer do you see yourself experiencing right now? Realizing this, you are ready to take the next step.

As you read the following meditations, I invite you to begin by repeating the phrase several times, in time with your breathing. Let it relax you and help you focus on what lies ahead and within.

**Deliver us from evil,** especially the evil that looks good to us. Let us not be distracted by what others do but focus on our own need for liberation.

**Lead us not into temptation** so that my temptations become like my shadow, which shows me where light can be found.

Give us this day our daily bread as we trust in You to give us all that we really need and to take from us whatever we love more than You. All that you send our way today is bread for us, food for our faith, hope, and love. We starve not from lack of Your giving but from failing to accept all that You offer and in the way that You offer it.

Thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven by us through obedience to Your Word and Grace as revealed

to us in the Scriptures and the teaching of the Church. Without obedience to You we cannot claim to love You. Without dedication to the study of Your teaching we cannot hope to be useful to You. Heaven is where Your will is fully and lovingly done. Hell is where selfishness and self-destruction reign.

Thy Kingdom come through us who pray these words. You choose us to be instruments of Your Kingdom and collaborators in the establishment of a New Creation, just as the saints in former times. Let Your vision and values color our thinking, feeling, relating, acting and being in the world.

Hallowed be Thy name in a world where the names of the rich, famous, and powerful are too highly regarded. May we honor Your name in deed as well as in word.

Who art in heaven and for us, Your presence is a taste of heaven on earth. Like a fish needs water and trees need their roots deep in the earth, so Your presence is our natural habitat.

Our Father by Baptism, Who desires to be a loving father to all humanity, may we live in awareness of Your awesome love and care and also our call to live in such a way that others will know Your loving presence by the things we say and do.

His goal was to raise the level of the Men of Malvern to 10,000 and, on a daily basis; he reminded the staff of this goal. He was determined to make this goal during his tenure with the retreat house working closely with the CA Captains, the staff and visiting parishes on weekend.

Those who knew Bob well understood his desire for privacy in providing countless retreats to men and women who could not afford a retreat. Reaching into his pocket, he would discreetly pay for someone in a financial crisis; after all, he knew the power of a retreat and its life-changing effects. He was the first CA Captain of the Divine Mercy Retreat initiated in 2006 and consistently attended other retreats throughout the year.

As a way of honoring Bob and his family, his desire to enhance the legacy of the retreat house, we are initiating the Bob Moore Memorial Blessing Fund. Monies donated for this purpose will be utilized to help renew Upper McShain creating a newer, brighter space of worship. Master carpenter Bob Perricone is building a new altar for Upper McShain to be dedicated in Bob Moore's memory.
