Actions Not Words – the Impact of Sr. Pauline Mary McShain, SHCJ



N MARCH 16, I ATTENDED THE funeral for Sister Pauline Mary McShain, SHCJ. If the name sounds familiar, it is because Sister Polly, as she was known, was the only child of John McShain and Mary Horstmann. John McShain played a significant role in not only building Washington, DC from the 1930s to the 1960s - including structures like the Pentagon, Jefferson Memorial, and the John F. Kennedy Center for the Performing Arts - he was also responsible for providing Malvern Retreat House with Upper and Lower McShain.

Upon her mother's death, Sister Polly was focused about dissolving the McShain Charities Foundation. Because of her father's relationship with the retreat house, she contacted Fr. Dennis O'Donnell, who was rector at the time, regarding any special needs for MRH. Fast forward, Sister Polly decided to contribute \$3 million from the family foundation to assist with constructing the new \$5.9 million McShain Horstmann Family Life center on our campus.

It is important for us to recognize and remember the historic significance of Sister Polly and her parents. They made a difference in building up MRH to what it is today. That thought triggered some reflection for me about a few important points regarding our apostolate and the life and contributions of the McShain's.

• Sister Polly was quoted in the "Irish Edition" periodical from February 22, 2011 as saying, "Our lives of love and peace should speak louder than words" while reflecting on the motto of the Society of the Holy Child Jesus, which reads: "Actions not words." Not only did Sr. Polly live that motto during her 70 years as a religious sister, but it was also bred in her by her parents through their own example of philanthropy and faithfulness to Catholic causes. That motto and the words of Sister Polly resonate with us, as well as challenge our work at MRH. We are called to be people of action not just words.

• As a lay- owned and operated organization throughout the past 100 years, we have been entrusted with making this apostolate because they experienced the sacred mystery of MRH. This place provides a safe, unique and exceptional space where people come to encounter Christ, unburden their soul, search for the truth, find renewal and healing, and leave energized by faith to make a difference in the world. Although we are flawed and incomplete people, the Lord uses our grounds, facilities and the ministry at the retreat center as a means of inviting people to know him better, to reassure them of his love, to call them to a deeper conversion, and to send them out as disciples fortified to face the challenges of the world. What the McShain's experienced



function and flourish apart from official Church support. We receive no funds from the Archdiocese of Philadelphia nor from the United States Catholic Conference. We have critically depended and thrived upon the generosity and faithfulness of pillars like John, Mary and Sr. Polly McShain. While we seek other exceptional pillars who can make significant contributions to our work, it is also the ongoing generosity of countless "ordinary" people who believe in the mission of MRH that keeps us going year after year. The significance of MRH being lay- owned is not lost. Our retreatants carry the torch of support passed on from one generation to the next.

• The McShain's stepped up in exceptional and exemplary ways to support our ministry here is repeated thousands of times every year.

• Sister Polly spoke of the impact of her father's relationship with MRH. From the book Malvern Retreat House: Celebrating 100 Years of Faith, Prayer and Service, In 2011, Sister Polly shared:

The date of my father's first retreat may be recorded in Malvern's archives. Although I do not know this, I am acutely aware of the lasting impression those days made on him. For the rest of his life, his retreat weekend at Malvern was sacrosanct; nothing could interfere with that.

Rector's Reflection

THIS IS MY FIRST ARTICLE FOR PROSIT so I would like to share some information about myself. My dad and mom were born in Ireland and met in Philadelphia. They both worked for Tastykake and met in the elevator after their shift. (That is not very important, but it is cute. And the elevator was going up!) My dad worked in Nice Ball Bearing factory his whole life and my mom worked in Williamson's Restaurant on City Line Ave. My brother and his family live in Massachusetts and my three sisters and their families in the Philadelphia area. I have seventeen nieces and nephews and Katie is my favorite. (Just kidding, I love them all, but Katie is the funniest-no filter, if you know what I mean.) I am really lucky to have a great family that all get along. I share all this with you because I am just a city kid from a middle class family and that's who I am.

I grew up in the Olney section of Philadelphia, was part of St. Helena' parish, and graduated from Cardinal Dougherty High School in 1978. I went to college in Worcester MA. and after college lived in a monastery in Pittsburgh as I discerned joining a religious congregation of priests and brothers called The Passionists. When I left the Passionists I attended St. Charles Seminary and was ordained in 1988. Since then, I have served as an associate pastor, a high school teacher and chaplain, the campus minister for the Newmann Ministry at Drexel University and the University of Pennsylvania, and pastor at several parishes. I have been involved with retreats my entire priesthood but I have never been the priest on staff at a retreat house, so there is a lot I need to learn. For now, I just want to observe and learn about the great things

happening at Malvern. I also want to visit other retreat houses and centers to learn what they are doing, to see what is working and not so much.

This sounds so odd to say but I really love the Church. There are plenty of things I do not love about the Church, (just watch the news or check out your favorite news feed,) but I still really love the Church. For you theologically geeky people who might be reading this, the word "church" never appears in the Gospel of Mark, Luke or John. The word only appears in Matthew's Gospel and there it appears two times. What I really love about the Church is the mission of the church, the reason she exists at all. At the end of Matt hew's Gospel, many feel that Jesus gives the clearest explanation of the mission that he entrusts to the Church. He says, "Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you." There are basically two parts to that great commission, to make disciples and then to make fully devoted disciples. I love that mission.

The Catholic Church calls this mission of making disciples of Jesus Christ and then helping them to be the best disciples possible, the mission of evangelization. The Church goes further and says that her mission is the mission of evangelization. In a spectacular example of mission clarity, the Catholic Church states in her documents, "The Church exists to evangelize." (Evangelization in the Modern World) I love that mission. Now I know how most of you feel. You would sooner go to the dentist that evangelizes. (No offense to you dentists, especially to you Joe C.) But most Catholics feel this way about evangelizing because they do not properly understand evangelization and because there are so many misunderstandings about evangelization out there.

Let me give you just four examples of how you evangelize without even knowing it. When you have a conversation with someone who is curious about Christ and nudge them closer to having at least some type of a conversion, you are evangelizing. When you support a person who is in the process of making a commitment to Jesus Christ, you are evangelizing. When you participate in anything that helps Catholics, Orthodox and Protestants get along with each other and celebrate what they share in common, you are evangelizing. When you grow in your own holiness and help other Catholics do the same, you are evangelizing. See, many of you have been evangelizing and didn't even realize it. Keep on evangelizing.

As I begin my service here, I am looking forward to meeting many of you who are part of the Malvern Retreat House family. I also look forward to working with a great team of people on staff and with the members of the Board of Directors who steward so well all that Malvern is. Finally, I am really looking forward to working here at the Malvern Retreat House and being part of the mission of evangelization--a mission that Malvern has been achieving since 1912. That is one hundred and seven years of evangelization.

FEVIN REILLY'S STORY isn't merely about survival. It's a tale of overcoming tremendous adversities and realizing the potential to be a true champion.

When cancer surgery left Kevin Reilly without his arm, four ribs and a large portion of his left shoulder, many well-meaning people told Kevin he would no longer be able to carry on the life he'd been leading. Fortunately, Kevin ignored them. He went on to achieve incredible goals and overcome overwhelming obstacles that will make you marvel at the strength of the human spirit. Because when a human being is forced to come to terms with a serious disability, their personal victories frequently happen during those dark hours in the middle of the night when no fans will cheer for you and your toughest adversary is yourself. Kevin's natural leadership skills and athletic abilities secured him a full athletic scholarship to Villanova University. Fellow Villanova alumni include close friend and NFL great Howie Long and former Philadelphia Eagles All-Pro running back Brian Westbrook. While at Villanova, Kevin was voted the team's MVP and first team All-East linebacker.

In 1975, Kevin's NFL career was cut short when he was diagnosed with a rare desmoid tumor. To halt the spread of cancer, Kevin's left arm, most of his shoulder and four ribs were amputated. He was told he'd never be able to tie his shoes or a tie, much less play sports. He didn't listen. After retiring from the NFL, Kevin worked as a Senior





Executive in Sales and Marketing at the Xerox Corporation. Kevin hosts the pre-game and post-game radio show for all Philadelphia Eagles games live on 94.1 WYSP-FM, Sports Radio 610WIP-AM and WDEl. He never gave up sports altogether - he is an avid runner and golfer, two of the many things people told him would be impossible after his surgery.




forward to his annual weekend at Malvern and tried to convince many of his friends, relatives and colleagues to accompany him.
