This has been a year of historic proportions not only for our country and our world, but also for the operations of Malvern Retreat House, But God moved MALVERN FORWARD!

When we suspended all on-site retreat activities on March 13, 2020, we thought that, perhaps, we would be living in that situation for a month or two. After twelve months, we are still dealing with the impact of the COVID environment. The bad news is that we experienced an unprecedented financial hit, many retreatants were blocked from their retreat experience, all of our employees were furloughed at some level, some never returned, and the retreat house was quiet - too quiet! But God moved MALVERN FORWARD!

The good news is that we began reopening gradually in mid-July. We learned the importance of staying connected with our retreat community in new ways. We developed daily video reflections. We learned that virtual retreats can be effective though not ideal. Under the circumstances, adapting the retreat format to one overnight or only one full day showed that great spiritual blessings

could still happen. Our COVID-19 Task Force met for hundreds of hours exploring and establishing protocols for ways that we could re-commence retreat activities safely for our employees and guests. After setting the audacious goal of raising \$1.2 million dollars in six months, the retreat community demonstrated their love and commitment for our mission by surpassing that goal by raising \$1,208,073. Yes, God moved MALVERN FORWARD!

Despite the huge, ugly obstacles, the people of God showed up! Reflecting on our experience at the retreat house, we see that many thousands of people turned to the Lord and felt emboldened by His message from the Prophet Jeremiah:

Listen to my voice; then I will be your God and you shall be my people. Walk in all the ways that I command you, so that you may prosper.

Despite the harsh COVID environment, people continued to long for the voice of God. People sought solace and strength from the daily written reflections on the Word of God by Deacon Tony Cincotta, from the ongoing video reflections, by Fr. Jim McGuinn and others, that have become a retreat house staple, as well as growing closer to the Lord even through a shortened or virtual retreat. Our staff had salaries cut and experienced furlough, but did not harden their hearts; but rather invested themselves even deeper into the Malvern Retreat House mission with the desire to do whatever it takes to keep helping people to encounter Christ and to find peace. Yes, God moved MALVERN FORWARD!

The distance from others was agonizing. Going weeks and months without access to Mass and the sacraments was heart breaking. Seeing the well-being of our beloved retreat house threatened,

created anxiety and unease. Dealing with the countless restrictions imposed by health and government authorities tested our patience, and challenged our accustomed freedoms. With operations, the additional endless hours of new demands and extended work responsibilities stretched us in ways that we never imagined. Yet, in all of us, we prospered. Prospered? Yes, because we learned in new ways about the God that calls us "my people". Yes, God moved us forward!

Despite the challenges, struggles, hurt and alienation, the *Rock of our Salvation* proved himself ever faithful. In some ways, the experience of this past year has felt like an extended Lent; as if we are wandering in the desert. Nonetheless, we live in hope knowing that our God will not lead us astray. He will lead us in the right path, directing our steps along firm ground even as we encounter new experiences on our journey toward the Promised Land. Yes, God is moving us forward!


Because of the COVID experience, we are embarking on a process of re-imagining Malvern Retreat House. This does not mean that we will toss out our history and the core of our identity. As God has led us through COVID by showing us new ways that we can enhance our mission to respond to the current need, so, too, will his Holy Spirit guide us toward fresh ideas about how to invite people to encounter him, to grow in relationship with him, and to move from this world into eternal life with him. Yes, God is moving us forward!

As we begin to see signs that the worst of the coronavirus will soon be behind us, we live in anticipation of what is to come. N 9-11 I WAS TEACHING AT BISHOP SHANAHAN HIGH SCHOOL AND TWO THOUSAND STUDENTS, FACULTY AND STAFF SAW THE WORLD CHANGE RIGHT BEFORE OUR EYES. Things would never be the same again. On 2-11-2019 my world changed. It certainly was not as dramatic as that day in Shanahan, but on 2-11 I received my new assignment from Archbishop Chaput to be the Rector at the Malvern Retreat House. On 3-11-20 the world changed again. Most of us can still remember where we were on that day and what happened to make it clear things were not going to be the same much longer. The WHO officially declared the COVID 19 crisis to be a global pandemic, the tip off of a really important basketball game was held up and then the game mysteriously cancelled, and the President addressed the nation that evening. That things were about to change would be an understatement.

COVID 19 changed our lives, our families, and our friends. It changed the way we touched other people, the way we shopped and the way we worked. It changed how we worshipped God, pumped gas, and

breathed. It also changed the Malvern Retreat House. Well, it did, and it didn't. Let me explain.

Unlike its name suggests, the Malvern Retreat House does a lot more than just offer retreats. For sure, it does offer weekend retreats, but it also offers programs and events, and it offers all types of sponsored activities, and it hosts more and more retreats every year, and yes, all that did change. Many of those activities

were cancelled this past year and the ones that were held were much smaller than before. Our financial situation changed, our staff changed, our grounds changed, our expectations changed and for some of us, our health changed, And the changes are not over just because the COVID 19 situation is a little better now than it was a month ago.

But there are things that did not change.

People are still looking for a sacred time and place to deepen their relationships with God and Malvern is still a place where that happens. People are still looking for purpose and meaning in their lives and Malvern helps them find what they are looking for. People are still wounded and hurting, and Malvern is a clinic for some of them or a hospital for others. Significantly,

the vision of Malvern to be the best retreat house possible and the mission to change peoples' lives has not changed. And most importantly, God's love for every single person and His desire that they have the fullness of life in Jesus Christ has never changed.

t As we continue to reflect on COVID 19 pandemic, lets acknowledge and grieve what has changed. But just as importantly,

let's celebrate God's love for each one of us and find peace and comfort in that.

TUST ONE YEAR AGO, ALMOST TO THE DATE, MALVERN RETREAT HOUSE CLOSED ITS DOORS FOR THE FIRST TIME IN ONE HUNDRED YEARS. In the last one hundred years, the retreat house remained open during the Spanish Flu pandemic, World War I & II, the Stock Market crash, the Great Depression, and through the duration of the Polio and Smallpox epidemics. If you recall, in those early days of the coronavirus pandemic, almost the entire world was in lockdown, and everyone was filled with fear and uncertainty while navigating uncharted territory. We knew this time; this hardship was painstakingly different, and the very act of mingling with family and friends could mean contracting a grave illness or death sentence for a person we loved.

The State of Pennsylvania was in lockdown – the red phase – with only essential businesses open, which meant we could not host any retreat gatherings. As the state moved to the yellow phase, the Board of Directors and staff began preparing to restart retreats for the eventual move to the green phase when businesses were allowed to reopen. Focused on how the retreat house would safely reopen, the COVID-19 Task Force consisting of several Board members and key staff began addressing staff and retreatants' health and safety with a coordinated, decisive, and phased reopening plan.

In July, we began to host the first retreats at the Family Life Center. The cautious and guarded reopening went well. As each retreat group came to our grounds in the coming weeks and months, the staff fine-tuned what was essential to keeping everyone safe. The momentum at times was rocky as guidelines from the CDC, the State of Pennsylvania, and Chester County changed, still the retreat house responded, adapting protocols focused on being a safe sanctuary for the retreat community and staff. Other retreat houses are now utilizing our exemplary protocols developed by the COVID-19 Task Force as a means to reopen their doors safely. The Board of Directors is exceedingly grateful for the retreat house staff for their unceasing vigilance and tireless efforts during these unparalleled times. Because of their extraordinary efforts, our doors remain open today.

We cannot overlook you, the retreat community, the Men and Women of Malvern who also helped keep our doors open. For without your prayers and support, we could not have done what we did. You were the quiet multitudes praying for us and the

work we needed to accomplish. You participated in virtual town hall meetings, spoke to us by phone, and expressed appreciation for retreat house communications. You rose to the occasion by supporting "Malvern Forward! Together we can. With God's grace, we will!" Campaign. You know the value and importance of taking time to be with God, especially on our holy grounds. You often tell me of the peace you encounter as you come on to these grounds and how grateful for the time you spend with God when you are here. Yes, you, too, have helped to keep the doors open.

Today our doors remain open, albeit in a different format from previous retreats. Be assured the Board of Directors and staff will bring back the Traditional Men and Women of Malvern retreats when it is safely possible and continue to look for ways to create new retreat experiences. As I said to the Board during our December 2020 meeting, "Malvern Retreat House was created for this moment and called for this moment." The Board, staff, and entire retreat community will rally together for what it takes to answer God's call to keep our doors open for generations to enjoy the retreat experience and experience His love and grace in their lives.

Malvern Retreat House Board of Directors News

Board of Directors Votes Unanimously to Extend the Term of Board Chair, Jacqueline Delaney

On February 3, 2021, the Malvern Retreat House Board of Directors voted unanimously to take the extraordinary step to extend the term of Jacqueline Delaney, Board Chair, for a period of one year, commencing April 7, 2021 and expiring April 6, 2022. The genesis of this decision comes from the serious impact of COVID-19 upon our beloved retreat community.

Both the Nominating and Governance Committee, as well as the Executive Committee recommended, without reservation, to place in consideration a vote on this matter from the entire Board of Directors. Boards may make decisions to extend the service of a Chair whose term will soon expire when an organization is facing extraordinary challenges or in the midst of major campaigns.

Based on the strength, passion, and determination demonstrated by Jacki Delaney in leading the Board of Directors in a positive way in advancing the mission and principles of the retreat house, amid issues of centennial magnitude, the Board agreed that this decision was in the best interest of the retreat house. The Board expressed its gratitude for Jacki's willingness to accept this recommendation.

James Molinari will continue serving in his role as Vice-Chair of the Board. Jim displayed exceptional humility, awareness, and dedication in spearheading this initiative. Although likely to have been confirmed as the next Chair at the Malvern Retreat House Annual Meeting in April, Jim discerned the importance of maintaining Jacki's leadership throughout the pandemic as well as the resulting tumultuous challenges brought upon the retreat house. Brought about through prayer, Jim's inspiration triggered the process to ensure that this unique decision moved forward in faith, trusting that it was the right decision for the right reasons. The approval of new and returning Board members will be voted upon at the 2021 Annual Meeting.

Looking at where we are now, one could ask, how did we get here?


BECAUSE OF YOU!
